They were reaching deeper inside and finding something more. They made a greater difference. I don't believe they would have understood these words - "he held the frame so we both could see the inscription" - "the way I did."
- B. "I remember my parents and other adults in my hometown saying, "Study hard and work hard but don't let your dreams get too big. If you do that, you'll only be disappointed."
- C. "Learn to fit in and go along," they said, "that's what successful people do." I got very good at fitting in and going along." His voice trailed off.
- D. "Robert, you're going to hear the same kinds of things from people around you. They're well-intentioned but they're wrong. What if I hadn't accepted it? What if every day I had questioned yesterday's definition of my best? What if I'd listened to my own heart, instead of their words? Then I might have kept looking deeper and giving the world more of the best that was hidden inside me."
- E. "And if I'd done that," he said, "more of the best would have come back to me, and to this family, and to you, Robert. But it won't," he said, "because I didn't do it."
- F. "So this is my challenge to you-to live these words." He handed me the frame. There was no glass in it; I ran my fingertips over the words and felt the brittle paper.
