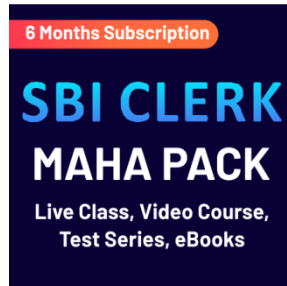

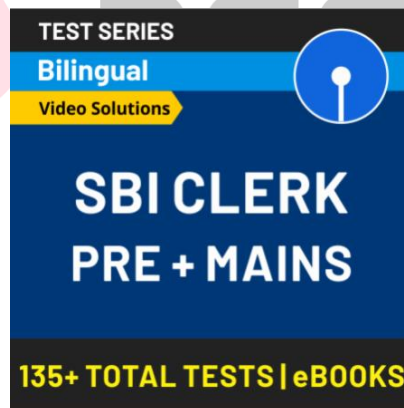

Solutions

S1. Ans. (c)

Sol. While introducing oneself, possessive pronoun '**myself**' should not be mixed up with subject pronoun 'I'. hence, option (c) is the right answer choice.

S2. Ans. (d)

Sol. Here, instead of 'I am having', it will be 'I have' in part (D). Hence, option (d) is the right answer choice.

S3. Ans. (b)

Sol. 'Have' will be replaced by 'has' as 'The jacket' is a singular subject. Hence, option (b) is the right answer choice.

S4. Ans. (a)

Sol. **Cope** is a verb which means **to manage**. **Cope** is followed by the preposition **with** and it is never followed by **up**. Hence, option (a) is the right answer choice.

S5. Ans. (d)

Sol. Here, 'by' will be replaced by 'on'. Hence, option (d) is the right answer choice.

S6. Ans. (c)

Sol. **Then** will be replaced by **than** because there is a comparison that more people die from solvent abuse **as compared** to any other illegal drug. Hence, option (c) is the right answer choice.

S7. Ans. (c)

Sol. In plural form, it is always mothers-in-law, brothers-in-law, sisters-in-law. **Son-in-laws** will be replaced by **sons-in-law**. Hence, option (c) is the right answer choice.

S8. Ans. (d)

Sol. The right answer choice is option (d). 'Defied' will be replaced by 'defying'.

S9. Ans. (b)

Sol. The right answer choice is option (b). Here, usage of 'to' is wrong making the sentence contextually and grammatically incorrect.

S10. Ans. (c)

Sol. The right answer choice is option (c). 'Issue' will be replaced by 'issues' here.

S11. Ans. (a)

Sol. The right answer choice is option (a). 'a' will be replaced by 'an'.

S12. Ans. (c)

Sol. The right answer choice is option (c). Here, 'saw' will be replaced by 'seen' as we use third form of verb with 'has/have'.
