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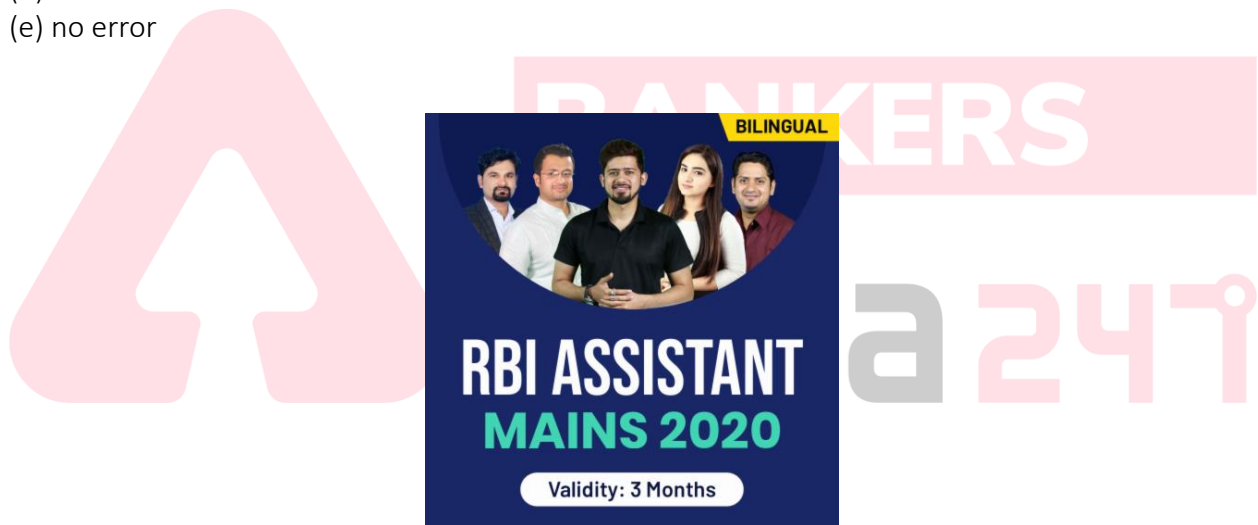

**Solutions:**

S1. Ans. (c)

Sol. In the given statement parts (C) and (D) contain grammatical errors. In part (C), 'are' must be replaced with 'is'. Also, in part (D), 'as well as' should be used instead of 'as'. Hence, option (c) is the most suitable answer choice.

S2. Ans. (a)

Sol. In the given part statement parts (B) and (D) contain spelling and idiomatic errors respectively. In part (B), 'Healthier' should replace 'healthiar'. In part (D), 'risks of' will replace 'risks in'. Hence, option (a) is the right answer choice.

S3. Ans. (d)

Sol. In the given part statement parts (A) and (C) contain grammatical and idiomatic errors respectively. In part (A), 'high with' should be replaced by 'high in'. In part (C), 'Knows' should be replaced by 'known'. Hence, option (d) is the right answer choice.

S4. Ans. (b)

Sol. In the given part statement parts (D) and (A) contain grammatical errors. In part (A), 'the' will be used before 'CISCE'. In part (D), 'residences' should replace 'residence'. Hence, option (b) is the right answer choice.

S5. Ans. (d)

Sol. In the given part statement parts (A) and (C) contain grammatical errors. In part (A), 'mount' will be replaced by 'mounting'. In Part (C), 'plays' will be replaced by 'play'. Hence, option (d) is the right answer choice.

S6. Ans. (b)

Sol. In the given part statement parts (D) and (A) contain grammatical errors. In part (A), 'Receive' will be replaced by 'receiving'. In part (D), 'positivity' will be replaced by 'positively'. Hence, **option (b)** is the right answer choice.

S7. Ans. (e)

Sol. Here, all the parts of the statement are correct. Hence, **option (e)** is the right answer choice.

S8. Ans. (d)

Sol. 1-3; containing, responsibility; should replace each other. Hence, **option (d)** is the right answer choice.

S9. Ans. (b)

Sol. 2-3; eliminate, period; should replace each other. Hence, **option (b)** is the right answer choice.

S10. Ans. (a)

Sol. 1-4: options, strained; should replace each other. Hence, **option (a)** is the right answer choice.

S11. Ans. (b)

Sol. 2-3: appointment, barred; should replace each other. Hence, **option (b)** is the right answer choice.

S12. Ans. (c)

Sol. 2-4; unalterable, governance; should replace each other. Hence, **option (c)** is the right answer choice.

S13. Ans. (e)

Sol. Here, the highlighted words are correct and there is no replacement required. Hence, **option (e)** is the right answer choice.

S14. Ans. (d)

Sol. 1-3: solace, cushioning: should replace each other. Hence, **option (d)** is the right answer choice.

S15. Ans. (b)

Sol. 2-3: specific, applications: should replace each other. Hence, **option (b)** is the right answer choice.

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
