Sol. Each of (i), (iii) and (ii) as starters could form a coherent paragraph after combining (I) and (II).

Sol. Both (i) and (ii) starters can be used to form a single sentence from the two sentences, implying the same meaning as expressed in the statement sentences. The sentences thus formed are:

(ii) Even though occasional accidents in an industry dealing in explosive materials may seem inevitable, the probability of such mishaps can certainly be reduced by adopting safe work practices.
Hence, option (e) is the right answer choice.
S9. Ans. (d)
Sol. Both the starters mentioned in the first and third options can be used to make a proper and meaningful sentence respectively. In both the cases, the connectors "Although" and "While" are used as the conjunction which give the similar meaning to the sentences so formed. However, the second starter is incorrect as it changes the meaning of the sentences aforementioned in the question.
(I)Although many of the major emitting nations had achieved significant reductions in 2016, it is imperative for all countries to accelerate their emissions reduction if the Paris goals are to be met.
(III)While many of the major emitting nations had achieved significant reductions in 2016, it is imperative for all countries to accelerate their emissions reduction if the Paris goals are to be met.

S10. Ans. (a)
Sol. Only the first starter can help in framing a suitable and logical sentence. The other two starters are incorrect as they cannot frame the sentence which connects the two statements in the same meaningful way.
(I) On returning to power in 1980, Indira Gandhi set up a new Department of Environment, for which a reputed botanist T.N. Khooshoo was hired as its Secretary.

S11. Ans. (b)
Sol. The passage is describing about the dwindling concern towards the farming sector of the country. Though the farmlands are considered as the heartbeats of the country, yet their issues are ignored by political parties. Thus, in context of the theme of the passage, the word "accretion" stands inappropriate as it means growth or increase by the gradual accumulation of additional layers or matter. The most suitable word to replace 'accretion' is 'agitation' which means a state of anxiety or nervous excitement. All the other words are precise in context of the passage; hence, the option (b) 'accretion' is the most suitable answer choice.
Deceive means deliberately cause (someone) to believe something that is not true, especially for personal gain.
Fizzled means make a feeble hissing or spluttering sound.
Bumper means exceptionally large, fine, or successful.


S12. Ans. (e)
Sol. The passage is describing about the dwindling concern towards the farming sector of the country. Though the farmlands are considered as the heartbeats of the country, yet their issues are ignored by political parties. All the given words are correct with reference to the theme of the paragraph. Hence, option (e) becomes the most suitable answer choice.
Straits means a narrow passage of water connecting two seas or two other large areas of water. Immune means protected or exempt, especially from an obligation or the effects of something. Seldom means not common; infrequent.

S13. Ans. (a)
Sol. Since the passage describes about the dwindling concern towards the farming sector of the country the incoherent word becomes "pragmatic". Pragmatic means dealing with things sensibly and realistically in a way that is based on practical rather than theoretical considerations. As the sentence mentions here that the blame of the poor condition of farmers should not be laid entirely upon BJP. All the parties are indifferent towards their issue. Thus, the most appropriate word to replace the incoherent word "pragmatic" is "unrealistic". All the other
given words are correct with reference to the theme of the paragraph. Hence, option (a) becomes the most suitable answer choice.
Hypocritical means behaving in a way that suggests one has higher standards or more noble beliefs than is the case.
Protest means an organized public demonstration expressing strong objection to an official policy or course of action.

## S14. Ans. (a)

Sol. The inaccurate word among the highlighted word is "garden".
Thus, 'garner' would be an appropriate word to form a coherent sentence. 'Garner' means gather or collect (something, especially information or approval). All the given words are correct with reference to the theme of the paragraph. Hence, option (a) becomes the most suitable answer choice.
Ambience means the character and atmosphere of a place.
Swayed means move or cause to move slowly or rhythmically backwards and forwards or from side to side.
Pitting means set someone or something in conflict or competition with.

S15. Ans. (a)
Sol. The inaccurate word among the highlighted word is "layoffs". 'Layoffs' means temporary suspension or permanent termination of employment of an employee or, more commonly, a group of employees. Since, the passage has mentioned about the protest of farmers, 'layoffs' becomes irrelevant in the context of the passage. The more appropriate word should have been "procession" which means a number of people or vehicles moving forward in an orderly fashion, especially as part of a ceremony. All the given words are correct with reference to the theme of the paragraph. Hence, option (a) becomes the most suitable answer choice.
Crumbled means cause (something) to break apart into small fragments.
Monopoly means the exclusive possession or control of the supply of or trade in a commodity or service.
Backing means help or support.
