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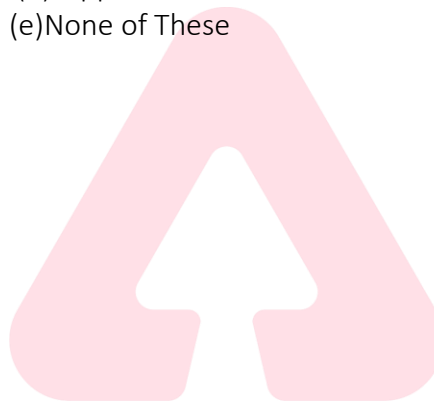

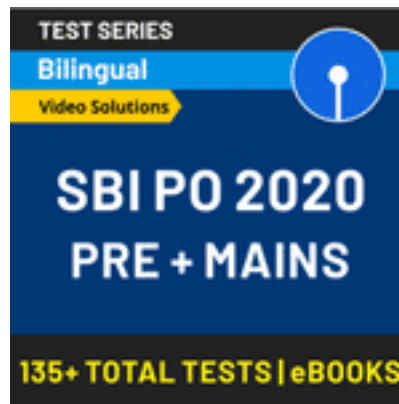

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Solutions

S1. Ans. (a)

S2. Ans. (b)

Sol. 'go-ahead' means 'proceed or be carried out'.

S13. Ans. (b)

Sol. 'Grow out of' means 'to develop from something that happened or existed before'.

Sol. 'Hold onto' means 'If you **hold onto** something that gives you an advantage, you succeed in keeping it for yourself, and prevent it from being taken away or given to someone else.'

Sol. 'Point out' means 'say something to make someone aware of a fact or circumstance; Draw/Call attention to'.
