Nation celebrates 480th birth anniversary of Maharana Pratap

Nation celebrates **480th birth anniversary** of **Maharana Pratap** on **9 May.** He was Born on **9 May, 1540.** To honour of the brave king, Maharana Pratap Jayanti is celebrated every year on 9 May.

About Maharana Pratap:

Pratap Singh I, popularly known as Maharana Pratap, was born to King Udai Singh II and Queen Jaiwanta Bai of Mewar. Udai Singh II died in 1572 in Gogunda and following his death, Maharana Pratap ascended the throne on 1 March, 1572. Maharana Pratap had to go to a battle against Mughal emperor Akbar, shortly after his coronation. Akbar had come to Mewar in order to chart out a route to Gujarat through the Rajput kingdom. The Maharana refused Akbar's offer and went to battle against the Mughals. This led to the famous Battle of Haldighati on 18 June 1576. The Mughal army emerged victorious in battle, but they failed to capture Maharana Pratap who escaped to the hills. Maharana Pratap passed away at Chavand, which served as his capital, on 29 January 1597.

"The Saras Collection" is a unique initiative of Government e-Marketplace (GeM) and the Deen Dayal Antyodaya Yojana-National Rural Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NRLM), Ministry of Rural Development. Under this initiative, the daily utility products made by rural self-help groups (SHGs) are exhibited and provided with the with market access to Central and State Government buyers. According to initiative, the products of the SHG sellers can be listed in 5 product categories, i.e.:

- Handicrafts
- Handloom
- Office accessories
- Grocery and pantry
- Personal care and hygiene

Maharashtra to provide free insurance cover premium to its people

The **Maharashtra government** has announced the inclusion of state's whole population under the **Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Jan Aarogya Yojana.** According to the announcement, state will provide free health treatment to cent per cent population of the state. With this inclusion, Maharashtra has become India's first state to provide free and cashless insurance premium to the people of the state.

At present, Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Jan Arogya Yojana is covering **85%** of the state's population. With the latest announcement, the benefits of the scheme have been extended towards the **remaining 15% people of state**. The latest announcement enables the state government, semi-government employees as well as the white ration card holders to apply for this scheme. Under the scheme, people in the state can avail the benefits of free and cashless health insurance. People needs documents such as ration card and domicile certificate to apply for the scheme.

Indian journalists wins Pulitzer Prize 2020 in feature photography

Indian journalists namely **Dar Yasin, Mukhtar Khan** and **Channi Anand** have been honoured with the 2020 Pulitzer Prize. These journalists have won the award in the field of feature photography. All the three journalists belongs to Associated Press. They have been awarded for the lockdown coverage.

The Pulitzer announced that the Indian journalists have been awarded for the contested territory of Kashmir as India revoked its independence, executed through a communications blackout. The Pulitzer Prize is considered as the highest honour that United States-based journalists and organisations can receive.

Outbreak of African Swine Fever in India

Outbreak of African Swine Fever in India. Assam has noted the first instance of African swine fever in the country. The outbreak of African Swine Fever(AFS) amid the **COVID-19 pandemic** has claimed more than 2900 domestic pigs across **306 villages of the state.** Assam's animal husbandry minister Atul Bora has said, was detected towards the end of February this year.The minister also said that the swine fever has started in April 2019 at a village in Xizang province of **China bordering Arunachal Pradesh.** Although veterinary official said the rate of death has decreased over the last 48 hours. Earlier in April, there were reported deaths of pig die to the classical swine fever(CSF).

ASF and CSF are different from **Swine flu (HINI)** and do not affect humans. CSF can be prevented by proper vaccination but there is no vaccination for ASF. Culling of the affected pigs is the only option. The AFS mortality rate is almost 100%. The focus is on preventing the disease from spreading and we have worked out some plans in consultation with officials, veterinary experts and pig farmers. The virus that causes AFS has not been found to infect humans, but they can be carriers, passing it on to uninfected pigs.

International Energy Agency (IEA) Releases "Global Energy Review 2020"

International Energy Agency (IEA) has released its report with title **"Global Energy Review 2020"**. This report comprises of estimates for **how energy consumption and carbon dioxide (CO2) emissions** trends are expected to develop over the rest of 2020.

Key findings of the Global Energy Review 2020: The report forecasts that energy demand will fall down by **6%** in 2020 i.e. seven times the decline after the 2008 global financial crisis. Due to the crisis posed by COVID-19 pandemic, demand of all fuels will be affected in the following manner:

- Oil demand is expected to drop by 9% which will return oil consumption to 2012 levels.
- Coal demand is expected to decline by 8%.
- Gas demand has been projected to fall much further across the 2020 accompanied by reduced demand in power and industry applications.
- Nuclear power demand would also face downfall of 3% in response to lower electricity demand.
- Renewables demand is expected to increase due to low operating costs as well as preferential access to many power systems. Hence, it will be the only energy source that will grow in 2020.

- It has been forecasted that global demand for biofuels is set to drop substantially in 2020 due to restrictions on transport and travel reduce road transport fuel demand, including for blended fuels.
- The report has also projected that electricity demand will fall by 5% globally.

National Affairs

- A National e-commerce marketplace **'bharatmarket'** will be launched by the traders' body Confederation of All India Traders (CAIT). The national platform **'bharatmarket'** will be launched for all retail traders, by CAIT in collaboration with several technology partners.
- The National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG) under the Ministry of Jal Shakti has jointly organised an IDEAthon on "The future of River Management' with the National Institute of Urban Affairs (NIUA).
- A **Bamboo Conclave** was held through Video Conference and featured the participation of representatives of **Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region (DoNER)**, the Union Ministry of Agriculture and various other stakeholders from different sectors.
- **Chandigarh government** has launched a new mobile app named "**CHDCOVID**" to provide COVID-19 related information. The app has been developed in-house by the **Society for Promotion of IT in Chandigarh** (**SPIC**).
- NITI Aayog has virtually launched a campaign in association with Piramal Foundation to protect senior citizens during COVID-19. The campaign has been titled as "Surakshit Dada-Dadi & Nana-Nani Abhiyan". The "Surakshit Dada-Dadi & Nana-Nani Abhiyan" targets to cover 2.9 million senior citizens in 25 #AspirationalDistricts across various states such as Assam, Bihar, Jharkhand, MP, Maharashtra, Rajasthan & Uttar Pradesh.

- The Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Alumni Council has launched a "COVID-19 test bus" in Mumbai, Maharashtra. The COVID-19 Testing bus will reduce 80% of the testing cost without compromising on the testing capacity.
- Styrene gas leaked from LG Polymers Plant in Vishakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh. The plant was located about 15 km from the coastal city of Vizag. The changes in temperature inside a storage tank resulted in a leak.
- The **Government of India** has launched its biggestever evacuation exercises named the **"Vande Bharat Mission".** In this exercise, the government bring back nearly **15,000 Indian nationals** stranded abroad due to the coronavirus lockdown.
- Union Health & Family Welfare Minister, Dr Harsh Vardhan has recently launched the mobile application 'AYUSH Sanjivani' App and two AYUSH based studies related to COVID-19 situation.
- **Defence Minister Rajnath Singh** has inaugurated new 80-km road in Uttarakhand which connects close to the **Line of Actual Control (LAC)** and opens a new route for **Kailash Mansarovar yatra via Lipulekh Pass**. The Border Roads Organisation (BRO) achieved road connectivity from Dharchula to Lipulekh (China Border) known as **Kailash-Mansarovar Yatra Route**.

States in the News

- The cabinet of Himachal Pradesh decided to starts the "Mukhya Mantri Shahari Rojgar Guarantee Yojna". In this Yojna, 120 days" assured employment will be provided to people living in urban areas.
- Himachal Pradesh state government plans to launch a new programme '**Nigah'**. In this programme, the state government educate the family members of the people coming to the state from other parts of the country.
- An "Exit App" has been launched by the **West Bengal government.** This app has been launched for people from other states who are stucked in West Bengal amid the nationwide lockdown and desires to return to their native place.
- Madhya Pradesh has become the 1st state in the country to provide mid-day meal ration. Distribution of the mid-day Meal ration with the help of Anganwadi workers, Panchayat representatives and local teachers was taken in sending ration to the students at their home after the school closing in April.


- Uttar Pradesh goverment has launched a "Pravasi Raahat Mitra" App to connect migrants with schemes and jobs. The app, developed in coordination with the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) to keep a watch on the migrants' health, will also connect them to government schemes and collect their data to help them get a job in accordance with their skills.
- The Jharkhand government has banned 11 brands of Pan Masala for one year in the state. The order was passed by the Commissioner of Food Safety in the state, Nitin Kulkarni. The state had collected 41 samples of Pan Masala belonging to different brands from different districts to test and analyse during the year 2019-20.

International Affairs

- **Russia** has planned to launch the 1st satellite named **Arktika-M** to monitor the Arctic climate and environment later this year. **Arktika-M 1 spacecraft** has been developed and is undergoing radio-electronic testing. This satellite is planned to launch at the end of 2020. The launch will take place on Soyuz 2,1b carrier rocket with frigate booster.
- Former intelligence chief of Iraq **Mustafa al-Kadhimi** becomes new Iraqi prime minister. Former PM **Adil-Abdul Mahdi** resigned in November last year.
- **China** has successfully launched a new rocket named **"Long March 5B"** into space as it steps up **Moon landing plans.** This rocket is launched in Wenchang launch site that is located on the island of Hainan, china.
- The Government of Iran recently takes a decision of changing the name of its currency to a **"Toman"**. Under the bill, Iran national currency is going to be changed from the rial to the **Toman**, which is adequate to **10,000 rials**.

Agreements/MoUs Signed

- Institute of Genomics and Integrative Biology (IGIB), constituent lab of CSIR, has signed a MoU with TATA Sons for licensing of KNOWHOW for FELUDA in order to execute rapid diagnosis of COVID-19.
- An Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) has been signed by the **PNB Housing Finance with Indian Institute of Technology, Delhi** in order to support Research & Development for reusable Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) to be supplied to government hospitals.





- Coal India signed MOUs with two Russian entities within the areas of coking coal mining within the Russian Far East and therefore the Arctic Region. The first MOUs was signed with Far Eastern Agency for Attracting Investments and Supporting Exports (FEAAISE), Russia and the second MoU was signed with Eastern Mining Company (FEMC) of Russian Federation for exploring, identifying, sourcing, negotiating and consummating interdependent investment opportunities within the mining sector within the Russian Far East.
- The **Ministry of Defence** has signed a pact with the **TATA POWER SED** to modernize infrastructure of **37 airfields of Indian Air Force.** The total cost of the project is estimated to be around Rs **1,200 crore.**
- Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) has entered into a tie-up with the India Post for delivery of its coronavirus COVID-19 testing kits. These kits are taken from ICMR 16 regional depots to 200 additional labs designated for coronavirus testing across the country.

Books and Authors

- Union Health Minister Dr **Harsh Vardhan** has launched a multimedia guide on the Covid-19 disease named 'COVID Katha'. The guide is launched on the occasion of the 50th DST (Department of Science and Technology) Foundation Day.
- The book titled 'Vijyant at Kargil: The Life of a Kargil Hero' has been released. This book is a biography of Vir Chakra awardee(posthumously) Captain Vijyant Thapar. This book is authored by Vijyant's father Colonel VN Thapar and writer Neha Dwivedi, a martyr's daughter. This book shows the journey of Vijyant Thapar to join the Indian Military Academy and the experiences that shaped him into a fine officer.



Banking/Economy/Business News

- HDFC Bank has released a song titled #HumHaarNahiMaanenge to keep hopes up amidst the ongoing national lockdown and Covid-19 pandemic. The lyrics of the song has been penned by Prasoon Joshi and music has been composed by AR Rahman.
- A customer engagement technology provider, Ameyo has launched video KYC engagement platform for the banking and finance sector. The newly launched platform will eliminate the businesses' requirement of physical KYC in accordance with latest RBI guidelines issued in January 2020. It is expected to decrease the customer onboarding process from the present 5-7 days to less than 3 minutes.
- The licence of The CKP Co-operative Bank Ltd., Mumbai to carry on banking business has been cancelled by the **Reserve Bank of India (RBI)** with effect from the close of business on **April 30, 2020**.
- **Moody's** cuts down India's Gross Domestic Product(GDP) growth **to "zero"** for the current **fiscal 2020-21**. Its previous estimate was 2.6%. In 2021-22 India's GDP growth rate will bounce back to **6.6%**.
- Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB) has approved a loan worth of \$500 million for India's 'COVID-19 Emergency Response.

Appointments/Resignations

- Max Bupa Health Insurance has appointed Krishnan Ramachandran as its new managing director (MD) and chief executive officer (CEO). He will replace Ashish Mehrotra.
- United States President, **Donald Trump** has nominated Indian-American **lawyer Ashok Michael Pinto** as US representative to World Bank's lending arm International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (IBRD).
- Economic Affairs Secretary, **Tarun Bajaj** becomes new director on Central Board of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI). His appointment is confirmed by the Government of India. He is a 1988 batch Indian Administration Service (IAS) officer. He will replace **Atanu Chakraborty**, who retired on April 30.
- Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury, Congress leader in Lok Sabha has been reappointed as chairperson of the Parliament's public accounts committee (PAC). He was reappointed the chairman of the committee by Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla.

- Lieutenant General **Raj Shukla** assumed command of the **Army Training Command (ARTRAC).** General Shukla was commissioned into the Regiment of Artillery in December 1982.
- An operation named **"Samudra Setu"** has been launched by the Indian Navy. "Samudra Setu" means "Sea Bridge". This operation is a part of India's effort to bring back Indian citizens who are stranded overseas amid COVID-19 pandemic.

Awards and Recognitions

- Joseph J Landsberg, Richard H Waring and Nicholas C Coops, share the 2020 Marcus Wallenberg Prize for forest sector' for 3-PG (Physiological Principles Predicting Growth), a model to predict forest growth in a changing climate. The prize 2020 will be presented by King Carl Gustaf XVI of Sweden during a ceremony in Stockholm, Sweden & the prize money is 2 million Kronor.
- Russian President Vladimir Putin has awarded North Korean Leader Kim Jong-un a commemorative war medal marking the 75th anniversary of the victory over Nazi Germany.
- **IIT Bombay Professor Saurabh Lodha** has been honoured with the **Young Career Award in Nano Science & Technology for the year 2020.**

Summit and Conference

• Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi took part in the online Summit of Non Aligned Movement (NAM) Contact Group. The summit was held with an objective to discuss response to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic crisis as well as to promote international solidarity in the fight against the COVID-19 pandemic. The summit was hosted by the current Chairman of NAM, President of Republic of Azerbaijan HE Ilham Aliyev, with the theme "United against COVID-19".

Science & Technology

- 17-year-old, Indian-origin girl, **Vaneeza Rupani** has been honoured of naming the **NASA's 1st Mars helicopter 'Ingenuity'**. she submitted her essay into NASA's "Name the Rover" contest.
- An **Ultra Violet (UV) Disinfection Tower** has been developed by **the Laser Science & Technology Centre (LASTEC)**, a premier laboratory of Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO). The UV Disinfection Tower has been developed to achieve rapid and chemical free disinfection of high infection prone areas.
- A defence public sector undertaking, **Bharat Dynamics Ltd. (BDL)**, ink pact with IIT Kanpur to make large-scale ventilators developed by **NOCCA Robotics (incubated start-up of IIT Kanpur)**.

Schemes and Committees

• The **Government of India** has constituted an Empowered Group for coordinating response activities **with Private Sector, NGOs** and International Organisations related to **COVID-19**.

Sports News

- World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) has banned Indian discus thrower Sandeep Kumari for 4 years after failing a drug test. National Dope Test Laboratory (NDTL) had failed to detect the banned substance "steroid" which was present in her blood sample.
- Swimming world governing body, Federation Internationale de Natation(FINA) rescheduled the 2021 Fukuoka aquatics world championships to May 2022 to avoid a clash with the postponed Tokyo Olympics.
- **The Tennis Integrity Unit** has banned the Egypt's tennis player **Youssef Hossam** from professional tennis for life. He has been banned from the game following his conviction on multiple match fixing and associated corruption charges.
- The **badminton World Championships 2020** has been postponed to November 2021. The tournament is traditionally held in August but will now take place from November 29 to December 5, 2021. World Championships will be held at the **Carolina Marin Stadium in Huelva, Spain.**

• World Press Freedom Day is observed globally on 3 May every year. It is also known as World Press Day. The theme of World Press Freedom Day 2020 is "Journalism without Fear or Favour".




