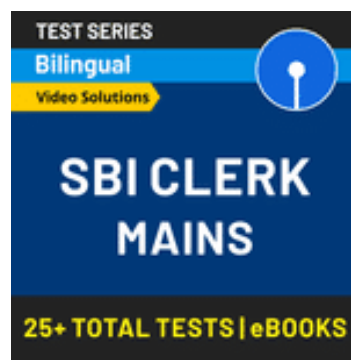

Sol. To make up something means to make up a story or lie about. Hence, **option (a)** is the right answer choice.

Fabricate: invent (something) in order to deceive

S2. Ans. (c)

Sol. To use up means to exhaust or use something completely. Hence, **option (c)** is the right answer choice.

S3. Ans. (e)

Sol. To come with means to contribute something (money or an idea). Hence, **option (e)** is the right answer choice.

S4. Ans. (d)

Sol. To put up with means to tolerate. Hence, **option (d)** is the right answer choice.

S5. Ans. (b)

Sol. To get by means to survive. Hence, **option (b)** is the right answer choice.

S6. Ans. (b)

Sol. Pass Out refers to losing consciousness or fainting. Hence, **option (b)** is the right answer choice.

Sol. Get up means to arise. Hence, **option (a)** is the right answer.
