Global Hunger Index 2024

The Global Hunger Index (GHI) is a comprehensive tool that tracks and measures hunger at the global, regional, and national levels. The 2024 GHI report sheds light on hunger levels across 127 countries, with specific emphasis on India's ranking and challenges.

India's Performance in GHI 2024

- India ranks 105th out of 127 countries in the Global Hunger Index 2024, placing it in the "serious" hunger category.
- India's GHI score is 27.3, indicating a severe level of hunger.

PM Internship Scheme

The Prime Minister's Internship Scheme was launched on October 3, 2024. This ambitious initiative, implemented through an online portal, aims to provide one crore young individuals with valuable internship opportunities over the next five years, allowing them to immerse themselves in diverse business environments and explore various professions.

Background

- Announced In: Union Budget 2024-25.
- **Aim**: To provide one crore internship opportunities over five years.
- **Platform**: Implemented through an online portal.
- **Objective**: Equip youth with skills and real-world exposure across diverse sectors.
- Pilot Project (2024-25)
- Target: 1.25 lakh internships.
- **Sectors Covered:** 24 sectors, including oil, gas, energy, travel, hospitality, automotive, banking, and financial services.
- **Company Selection**: Based on Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) expenditure over the past three years.







Key Highlights of the PM Internship Scheme

Eligibility Criteria

- **Age Range :** 21-24 years.
- Candidates: Indian nationals not employed full-time or engaged in full-time education.
- **Educational Qualifications :** High School, ITI certificates, diplomas, or bachelor's degrees (BA, B.Sc, B.Com, BCA, BBA, B.Pharma, etc.).
- **Program Duration: 12 months.**

Financial Assistance

- **Monthly Stipend**: ₹5,000 (₹500 from partner companies and ₹4,500 from the government via DBT).
- One-time Grant: ₹6,000 upon joining the internship.
- **Insurance Coverage:** All interns will be covered under Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jvoti Bima Yojana and Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana, with premiums paid by the government.

PM Internship Portal

- A centralized online platform to manage the internship lifecycle.
- Companies can post internship opportunities and shortlist candidates.
- Candidates can apply for up to five internships based on location, sector, and qualifications.

Global Multidimensional Poverty Index (MPI)

The 2024 Global Multidimensional Poverty Index (MPI) report highlights the alarming interconnections between violent conflict and multidimensional poverty across various nations. According to the report, approximately **1.1 billion** people live in acute multidimensional poverty, with 455 million residing in conflict-affected regions.

Key Findings

Child Poverty: Over half (584 million) of the impoverished population are children under 18, indicating a severe impact on the youth, with 27.9% of children living in poverty compared to 13.5% of adults.

Basic Needs: Many poor individuals lack essential resources, including adequate sanitation (828 million), housing (886 million), and cooking fuel (998 million).

Nutrition: Over 637 million people live in households with at least one undernourished individual, with South Asia and Sub-Saharan Africa being significantly affected.

Global Trends

Since the inception of the MPI in **2010**, it has served as an essential tool for identifying vulnerable populations. The report reflects on the achievements and ongoing challenges in poverty reduction, emphasizing the urgent need for investment in peace to effectively address poverty.

National Affairs

- The Central Government has officially revoked President's Rule in Jammu and Kashmir, paving the way for the appointment of a new Chief Minister. In a notification issued by President Droupadi Murmu, the revocation was enacted under the powers granted by the Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation Act, 2019, and relevant constitutional provisions. - India has surged to become the second-biggest supplier of restricted critical technologies to Russia, US and European officials said, highlighting the challenge in efforts to choke off exports fueling President Vladimir Putin's war machine.
- India's new role
- India has become the second-largest supplier of restricted technologies, such as microchips, circuits, and machine tools, to Russia, following China. (Click here to read article)
- The traditional Lady of Justice, often depicted blindfolded with scales and a sword, has undergone a symbolic transformation in the Supreme Court of India. Under the guidance of Chief Justice DY Chandrachud, the newly commissioned statue sheds the blindfold and replaces the sword with the Constitution.

Key Changes

No Blindfold

- Traditionally, Lady Justice was portrayed with a blindfold, symbolizing impartiality and equality before the law.
- The new statue, however, has its eyes open, symbolizing that justice is not blind in India, but instead aware, conscious, and empathetic.

The Constitution Replaces the Sword

- The sword, a traditional symbol of authority and punishment, has been replaced by the Indian Constitution.
- This emphasizes that justice is delivered in accordance with constitutional principles, not through violence or retribution.

Retaining the Scales

- The scales, a symbol of fairness and balance, remain in the new statue.
- This highlights the judiciary's commitment to weighing all sides before delivering judgment.(Click here to read article)
- In a significant ruling, the **Supreme Court on October** 17 upheld the constitutional validity of Section 6A of the Citizenship Act, 1955, with a 4-1 majority, affirming the Assam Accord. The bench, led by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud, deemed the provision constitutional, recognizing its role in addressing illegal immigration from Bangladesh into Assam.

- Assam Accord and Section 6A
- Section 6A, introduced in 1985 following the Assam Accord, grants citizenship to those who entered Assam before January 1, 1966, and allows others who arrived by March 24, 1971, to register after a 10-year waiting period. Those who entered after this cut-off are subject to detection and deportation.
- Majority Verdict vs Dissent
 - Chief Justice Chandrachud, along with Justices Surya Kant, MM Sundresh, and Manoj Misra, upheld the legislative competence of Parliament, recognizing the Accord as a political solution to the issue of illegal immigration. Justice Pardiwala, in dissent, argued that Section 6A violated Article 29(1), citing concerns over the ethnic composition of the region. (Click here to read article)
- In a significant policy shift, the Indian Railways has announced a reduction in the Advance Reservation Period (ARP) for long-distance train bookings from 120 days to 60 days, effective November 1, 2024. This decision aims to enhance passenger convenience by reducing the blocking of funds for ticket bookings made months in advance, especially during peak travel seasons like festivals. - In a significant move to tackle the rising tide of online scams and cyber frauds, the Secretary of Information and Broadcasting, Sh. Sanjay Jaju, delivered the keynote address at the launch of the "Scam se Bacho" campaign in New Delhi. This initiative, developed by Meta in collaboration with key government ministries. - On Saturday, Prime Minister Narendra Modi will inaugurate the 'Karmayogi Saptah' National Learning Week (NLW) aimed at enhancing the individual and organizational capacity of civil servants. This initiative, part of the broader 'Mission Karmayogi' launched in September 2020, seeks to foster a future-ready civil service that embodies Indian values while maintaining a global outlook.
- Objective of NLW
 - The NLW aims to reinvigorate commitment to learning and development among civil servants.
 - It promotes the "One Government" ethos, aligning participants with national goals and emphasizing the importance of lifelong learning. (Click here to read article)

States in the News

After devastating floods and landslides claimed over 200 lives in Kerala's Wayanad district in July 2024, the Union Ministry of Earth Sciences took a crucial step to bolster disaster preparedness by approving the installation of an X-band radar in the region. The torrential rains, which triggered a massive landslide in the valley above Punchirimattom near the Mundakkai area, led to catastrophic debris flows, intensifying the destruction. - Maharashtra Government Renames Skills University After Ratan Tata. In a significant tribute to the late industrialist Ratan Tata, the Maharashtra government announced on October 14, 2024, that the Maharashtra State Skills Development University will be renamed the "Padma Vibhushan Ratan Tata Skills University." This decision honors Tata's substantial contributions to education, skill development, and social causes across India.(Click here to read article)
- Telangana becomes the third state to initiate a castebased headcount, following Andhra Pradesh and Bihar. The Telangana government has initiated the process of a comprehensive household caste survey in the state aimed at targeted and equitable resource distribution among all communities. The caste survey aims to promote targeted and equitable resource distribution among all communities, ensuring justice for weaker sections like OBCs, SCs, STs, and other marginalized groups. - At the second edition of the **Indian Gaming Convention** (IGC), Shri Priyank Kharge, Karnataka's Minister of Information Technology and Biotechnology, expressed the state's ambition to lead the gaming and animation industry. Kharge stated, "Karnataka has all that is needed to ensure that we become the gaming and animation capital of not only this country but also of **Asia."** "India—the Next Superpower in Gaming" emphasizes India's growth trajectory to becoming a global leader in gaming.(Click here to read article)
- **Omar Abdullah.** a prominent leader of the **Jammu and** Kashmir National Conference (JKNC), has been sworn in as the new Chief Minister of Jammu and Kashmir, marking a significant political transition in the region.
- Abdullah took the oath of office in a ceremony administered by Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha. His ascension to the position comes after the National Conference emerged victorious in the recent elections, albeit without the direct involvement of the Congress party, which has chosen to provide external support instead. - The Kerala Assembly unanimously passed a resolution urging the BJP-led central government to withdraw the Waqf (Amendment) Bill 2024, which was introduced in the Lok Sabha in August and subsequently referred to a Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC). The state's lawmakers expressed concerns over the bill, asserting that it could undermine the autonomy of Waqf boards and the management of Waqf properties. (Click here to read article)
- To address the immediate skill gaps in Andhra **Pradesh,** Shri Jayant Chaudhary, Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) for the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, and Minister of State for the Ministry of Education, Government of India, inaugurated a new National Skill Training Institute (NSTI) extension center at the Andhra Medical Tech Zone (AMTZ) campus in Visakhapatnam. - The Assam government has launched an ambitious project aimed at revitalizing 129 beels (wetlands), covering an area of 3,800 hectares, to mitigate flooding and boost fish production in the state. These wetlands serve as essential water and fishery resources, offering vital hydrological regulation services, including flood mitigation, groundwater recharge, river flow regulation, and erosion control. - Nayab Singh Saini was sworn in as Haryana's Chief Minister for the second time, marking BJP's third consecutive term in power in the state. Governor Bandaru Dattatreya administered the oath at a ceremony attended by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Union Ministers, and NDA leaders. Saini's council of 13 ministers also took the oath. Saini, a Dalit leader from Kurukshetra, led the BIP to victory in the October 5 Assembly elections, securing 48 seats in the 90member house. (Click here to read article)
- Kaziranga National Park, renowned for its iconic onehorned rhinoceros, has now gained recognition as India's second-largest butterfly diversity hub. Following Namdapha National Park in Arunachal Pradesh, Kaziranga is home to an impressive 446 butterfly species. This newfound distinction highlights the park's rich biodiversity. - The "Mera Hou Chongba" festival was celebrated in Manipur amidst ongoing ethnic tensions between the Meitei and Kuki-Zo communities. This annual festival serves as a significant cultural event aimed at reinforcing the bonds of brotherhood and harmony among the indigenous communities of the state, highlighting the rich cultural tapestry of Manipur.
- The festival took place on the 15th Lunar day of Mera Month, at Sana Konung and Kangla Uttra in Imphal, the state capital. (Click here to read article)
- On the occasion of Valmiki Jayanti, Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah announced that all Scheduled Tribe (ST) residential schools in the state and Raichur University will be named after Maharishi Valmiki. (Click here to read article)
- In a significant move to strengthen bilateral ties, the Indo-Turkiye Friendship Association (ITFA) was inaugurated in Hyderabad on October 16, 2024. The initiative seeks to enhance cooperation in key areas such as economy and trade, culture and tourism, science and technology, and education between India and Turkiye. (Click here to read article)
- Union Minister of State for Science and Technology, Dr. Jitendra Singh, has inaugurated Pavana Chitra, India's first self-powered indoor air quality monitoring facility, located at Thiruvananthapuram International Airport. (Click here to read article)



In a significant move, Haryana Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini has fulfilled his first poll promise by announcing that all government hospitals in the state will provide free dialysis to chronic kidney patients. This decision was made during his inaugural cabinet meeting after the BJP's return to power for a third consecutive term, where Saini emphasized the people's mandate against Congress' narrative during the elections. International Affairs

- Nicaragua has officially severed diplomatic relations with Israel, a move announced by Vice President Rosario Murillo following a congressional resolution. This decision aligns with Nicaragua's leftist government, led by **President Daniel Ortega**, which has condemned Israel's actions in the ongoing Gaza conflict and labeled its government as "fascist and genocidal." - **United States** has announced it will send the advanced **THAAD missile defence system** to Israel. This move is part of a broader strategy to bolster Israel's defence capabilities and deter further aggression from Iran and other regional adversaries. The deployment underscores the US's "ironclad commitment" to Israel's defence and comes at a time of heightened geopolitical sensitivity in the region.
- What is THAAD?
 - THAAD stands for Terminal High-Altitude Area Defense, a cutting-edge anti-ballistic missile defense system developed by Lockheed Martin Corporation. The system is designed to intercept and destroy enemy missiles in their final, or terminal phase, making it a critical asset for defending against missile threats. (Click here to read article)
- Tensions between India and Canada have escalated significantly, particularly following the murder of Sikh separatist Hardeep Singh Nijjar in June 2023. This incident triggered a series of diplomatic retaliations, including the expulsion of Indian diplomats by Canada and subsequent expulsions by India. The conflict has deep roots, dating back to controversies involving Sikh separatism and criticisms exchanged over various issues, including farmer protests in India. (Click here to read article)
- Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla recently addressed the 149th Assembly of the Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU) held from October 13 to 17, 2024, at the IPU headquarters in Geneva, Switzerland. During his address, Birla emphasized the critical need for multilateralism in today's world, advocating for dialogue and cooperation among parliaments in the realms of science, technology, and innovation for the common good. - The Financial Action Task Force (FATF) has introduced significant changes to its criteria for placing countries on its grey list, aiming to relieve the burden on least developed countries (LDCs) while targeting nations that pose greater risks to the international financial system.
- FATF's Revised Criteria
 - The changes prioritize active reviews of countries that meet specific risk criteria, focusing on FATF Members.
 - Countries on the World Bank's High-Income Countries list (excluding those with only two or fewer banks in the financial sector).
 - Countries with financial sector assets above USD 10 billion.
 - Least developed countries will not be prioritized unless they pose significant risks related to money laundering or terrorist financing. (Click here to read article)
- India has fulfilled a significant commitment made during the third Forum for India-Pacific Islands Cooperation (FIPIC III) Summit by sending its first consignment of 12 Haemo-Dialysis machines to Papua New Guinea (PNG). Also in response to rising tensions and ongoing conflict in southern Lebanon, India has dispatched the first tranche of a 33-ton consignment of medical supplies as part of a humanitarian effort to support Lebanon. Agreements/MoUs Signed

- The Uttarakhand Madrasa Education Board (UMEB) has proposed making Sanskrit a compulsory subject in 416 madrassas across the state. This initiative aims to enhance the educational curriculum and support the academic growth of students. (Click here to read article)
 - India and Mauritania have taken a significant step towards enhancing their bilateral relations by signing four Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) during Indian President **Droupadi Murmu's visit** to the North African country. This visit, a historic moment in Indo-African diplomacy, marked the first time an Indian president set foot in **Mauritania**, as part of President Murmu's three-nation tour, which also includes Algeria and Malawi.
- During the visit, four MoUs were signed between India and Mauritania, aiming to enhance collaboration in multiple areas. These MoUs focused on:
 - **Training of Diplomats** Establishing a framework for capacity-building and exchange of knowledge between the foreign services of both countries.
 - 2. Cultural **Exchange** Fostering mutual understanding and appreciation through cultural programs, exhibitions, and artist exchanges.
 - 3. Visa Exemption Offering visa exemptions for diplomatic and official passport holders to facilitate smooth diplomatic engagements.



- Foreign Office Consultations Enhancing regular consultations between the foreign offices of both nations to ensure continuous dialogue on bilateral and international issues.
- India's relationship with Mauritania has witnessed steady growth over the past few years. The two countries held their first Foreign Office Consultations in Nouakchott on 21 March 2024, further underlining the importance both nations place on diplomatic dialogue. In terms of trade, the bilateral relationship has been gradually expanding. In the financial year 2022-23, the total bilateral trade stood at \$378.24 million, with India's exports to Mauritania amounting to \$146.57 million and imports at \$231.68 million.
- The Geopolitical and Economic Importance Mauritania Mauritania, an Islamic republic located along the Atlantic Ocean in Northwest Africa, is a strategically important country that acts as a transitional zone between Arab North Africa and the sub-Saharan African region. It is a member of the Maghreb region, which includes countries like Algeria, Morocco, and
- Although Mauritania is one of the poorer nations in Africa, largely desert-bound and with a significant nomadic population, it holds substantial reserves of natural resources, including **iron ore, copper, gypsum**, and some **oil resources**. The country's economic potential, particularly in mining and energy, presents opportunities for foreign investment, including from India. (Click here to read article)
- India and Colombia have signed an Audio-Visual Co-**Production Agreement** on October 15, 2024, to enhance collaboration in the film industries of both nations. This agreement, signed by Dr. L. Murugan, **India's Minister of State** for Information & Broadcasting, and Jorge Enrique Rojas Rodriguez, Vice Minister of Foreign Affairs of Colombia, marks a significant step in deepening cultural ties and cooperation across various sectors. The partnership aims to pool creative and technical resources, enabling filmmakers from both countries to collaborate on film projects, thereby expanding their markets and promoting goodwill. - Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) has been upgraded to the status of Maharatna, making it the 14th **Central Public Sector Enterprise (CPSE)** to receive this prestigious classification from the Government of India. (Click here to read article)
- A recent survey by the National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) highlights a remarkable increase in the average monthly income of rural households, which rose by 57.6% over the past five years. The second 'All India Rural Financial Inclusion Survey (NAFIS) 2021-22' reports that the average monthly income grew from ₹8,059 in 2016-17 to ₹12,698 in 2021-22, indicating a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 9.5%.
